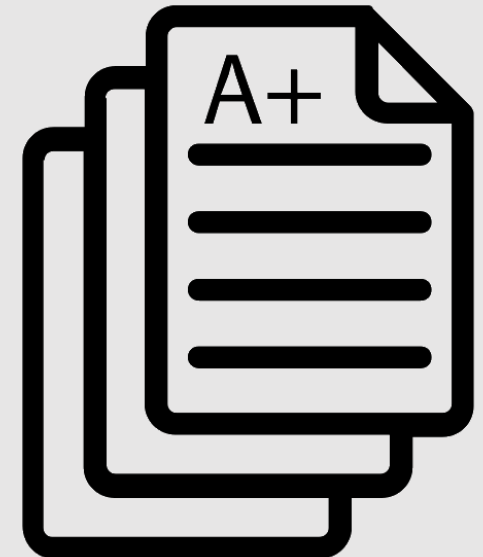

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Literature search – why?

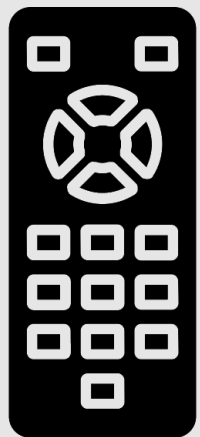
- Get better grades

Just as important in online environment as it is in physical environment:

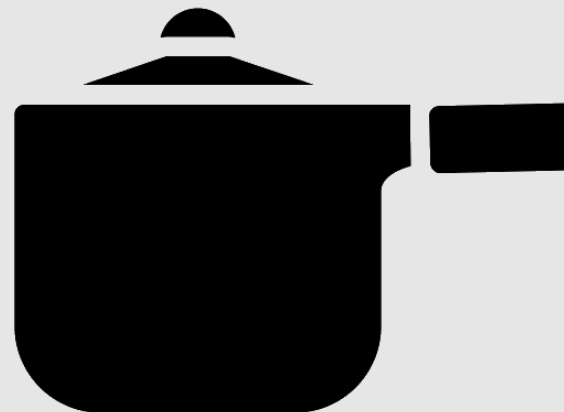
- Save time

Benefits of library search tools

Get to the best information quickly:

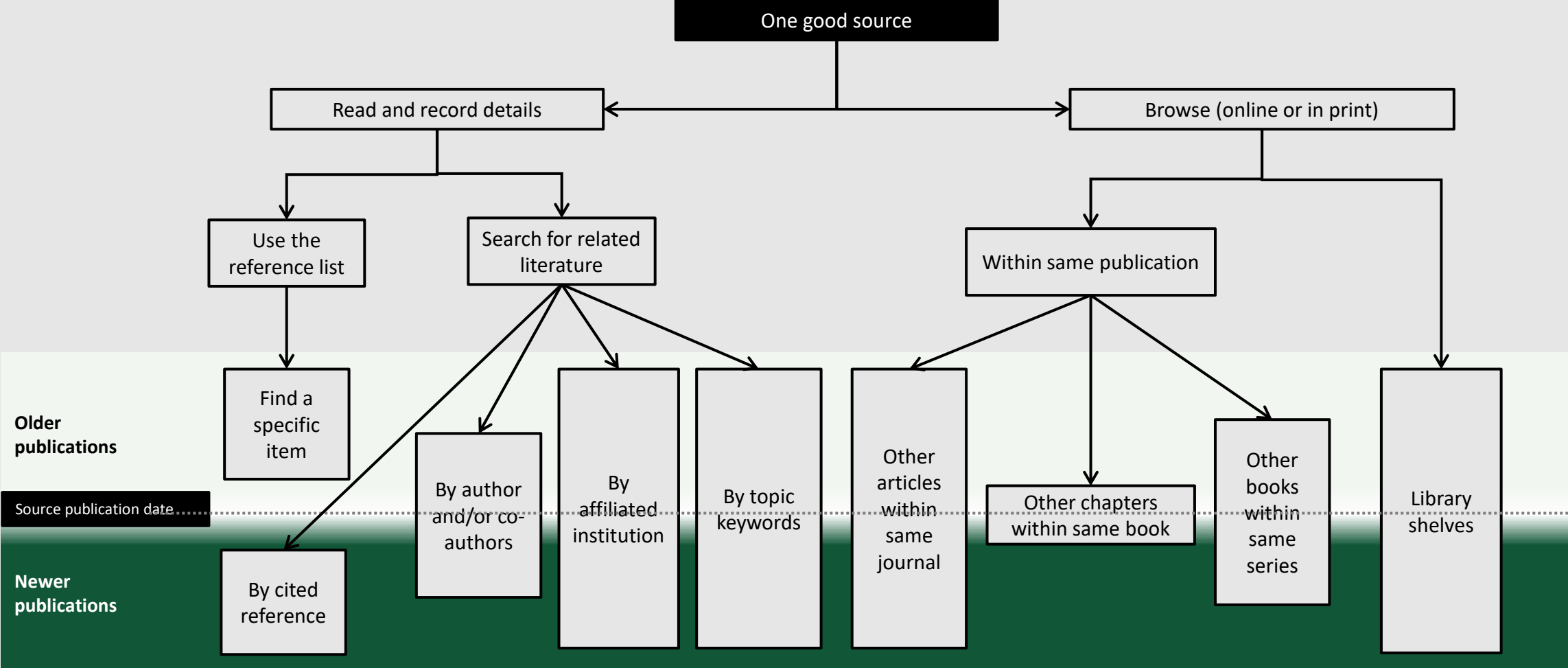
- Poor quality and irrelevant sources are excluded
- Precise filters to focus your results
- Full text access

 - [purchase recommendation](#)

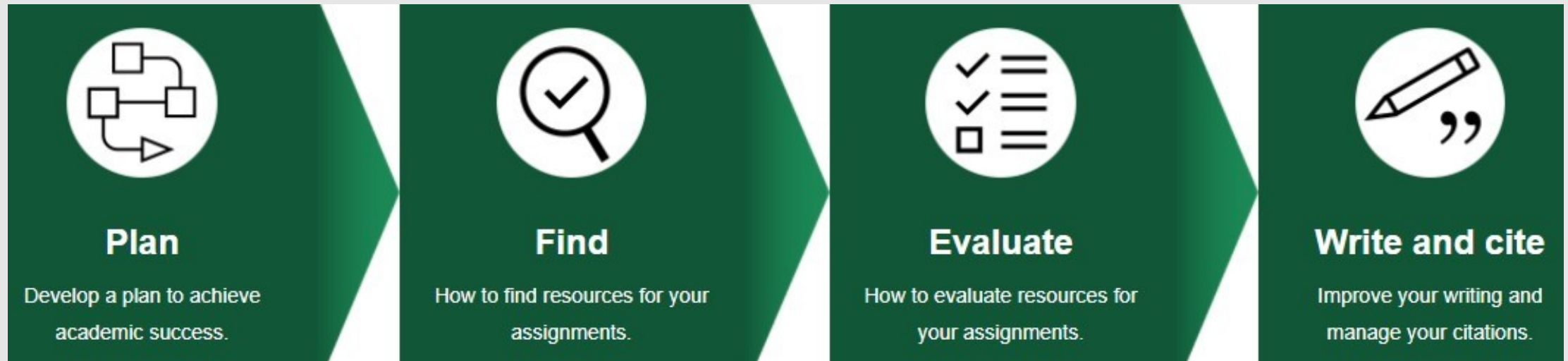
Literature search pathways



4-step process

1. Plan
2. Find – make notes 
3. Evaluate
4. Write and Cite (referencing)

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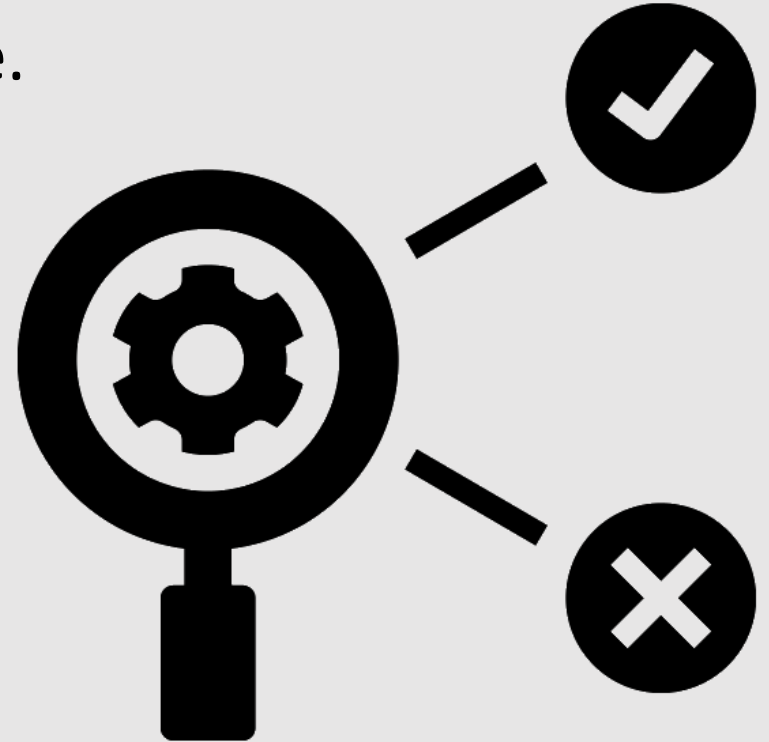
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Evaluate what you find

- You can't read everything. Be highly selective.
- Critically assess suitability of:
 - publication type – look in the right place
 - content – relevance to your project
 - title
 - abstract/summary
 - keywords
 - full text



[Evaluation frameworks](#) to guide your critical thinking

Publication types

- Conference papers
- Journal articles
- Practitioner magazine articles
- Patents – ask for help
- Standards – ask for help
- Webpages
 - Industry professional organisations websites
 - Company websites
 - Wikipedia pages 




Referencing – why?

- Get better grades
- Avoid plagiarism
- Avoid copyright and IP infringement
- Enable others to find your information sources



Help with referencing

- Use a standard referencing style – pick one
 - common styles IEEE, APA, MLA, ACM
- Record reference details of sources as you find them
 - manually
 - reference management software
 - BibTex file (LaTeX users)
- Get formatted references directly from search tools
