Question 3. Defining a Method

[10 marks]

Fill-em-up Dentists are a discount dental practice with a simple set of charges. They charge \$30 for the first visit, \$20 for every follow-up visit, plus \$40 per filling.

For example, for a treatment plan with 3 follow-up visits and 4 fillings, the total cost would be \$250 [= \$30 + (3 × \$20) + (4 × \$40)].

(a) [6 marks] Complete the following `fillEmUp()` method for calculating the estimated cost of treatment. The method should

- ask the user for the number of follow-up visits
- ask for the number of fillings
- calculate and print the cost of the fillings and the total estimated cost, (including the initial visit).

For example, if the user entered 3 visits and 4 fillings, the interaction should be the following (where the user's input is in bold):

```
Follow-up visits: 3
Fillings: 4
Cost of fillings = $160
Total cost = $250
```

(b) [4 marks] Suppose the dentists decide to modify their charges, by adding an additional charge of \$20 when there is only one filling, and also offer a discount of 10% on the total cost if there are 4 or more follow-up visits.

Complete the following `newFillEmUp` method for computing the updated charges.

The method should just print the total cost (it does not need to print the cost of the fillings)

Question 4. Methods, Arguments, and Parameters

Question 5. Using objects

[6 marks]

Suppose the Bus class has one constructor and two methods:

Constructor:

```
public Bus(int capacity)
    // constructs a Bus object , with the specified capacity , and displays it
    // at the left edge of the graphics pane, facing to the right .
```

Methods:

```
public void move(double dist)
    // makes the bus move forward by the specified distance in the current direction .
```

```
public void turn(double angle)
    // makes the Bus turn by the given angle (eg 90 to turn right , -90 to turn left )
```

Complete the following drive method, which should first create two Bus objects, one with capacity for 40 passengers, and one with capacity for 33 passengers. It should then make the first bus move forward 30 units and turn right, and then make the second bus move forward 20 units and turn left. It should then make each bus move forward a further 50 units.

Question 6. Defining and Calling Methods

[7 marks]

The following singAJingle method prints out a the words of a repetitive song.

```
public void singAJingle(){
    Ul.println ("Peter Piper picked 10 green peppers, ");

    Ul.println ("Peter picked 20 orange peppers for Mrs Piper.");
    Ul.println ();
    Ul.println ("James Johnson picked 7 green peppers, ");
    Ul.println ("2 red peppers, Mr Johnson picked, ");
    Ul.println ("James picked 17 orange peppers for Mrs Johnson.");
    Ul.println ();
    Ul.println ("Fred Fulsome picked 12 green carrots, ");
    Ul.println ("7 red carrots, Mr Fulsome picked, ");
    Ul.println ("Fred picked 22 orange carrots for Mrs Fulsome.");
    Ul.println ();
    Ul.println ("Kris Kringle picked 9 green potatoes, ");
    Ul.println ("4 red potatoes, Mr Kringle picked, ");
    Ul.println ("Kris picked 19 orange potatoes for Mrs Kringle.");
    Ul.println ();
    Ul.println ("Craig Carson picked 3 green beans, ");
    Ul.println ("0 red beans, Mr Carson picked, ");
    Ul.println ("Craig picked 13 orange beans for Mrs Carson.");
    Ul.println ();
}
```

(Question 6 continued)

The `singAJingle` method is not well designed: it has quite a bit of repetition and many literal values. It would be better design to define another method called `printVerse` which prints out a single verse (computing some of the numbers) and make `singleAJingle` call the `printVerse` method four times, as in the version of `singAJingle` below.

Complete the definitions of `singAJingle` and `printVerse` below so that they print out the same song. You will need to determine the appropriate arguments for the calls to `printVerse`, the appropriate parameters in the header of `printVerse`, and the statements in the body of `printVerse`. You should not use more than four parameters.

Note: Nobody can pick a negative number of any vegetable!.
