CatSIG discussion summary

How LMS providers are responding to changes in cataloguing practices

- LMS vendors often lack understanding of cataloguing needs, leading to poor communication and slow responses to changes.
 - Cataloguers' requests often go through system librarians who may not understand cataloguing, causing miscommunication.
 - Open-source systems like Koha allow flexibility but require users to fund changes or wait for community updates.
 - LMS updates sometimes improve certain features but degrade others.
 - Vendors often treat authority records as "too hard," resulting in limited support for authority data.
 - Some LMS platforms struggle with non-Roman scripts and diacritics (e.g., te reo Māori characters).
 - Corporate libraries face challenges with older cataloguing standards and limited vendor support.
 - Getting LMS vendors to respond changing needs or requirements for cataloguing is a slow process and requires libraries to drive the change.
- Cataloguers need better understanding of how metadata drives discovery layer features like faceting to be able to effectively advocate for changes in discovery layers.

How OPACs and Discovery layers handle authority metadata - if they do at all

- Authority metadata use is minimal; usually limited to name authorities being searchable.
- Discovery layers often rely on LMS for authority data rather than handling it themselves.
- Poor integration of authority metadata leads to navigation issues and unexpected search results for users.
- Some systems (e.g., SirsiDynix Enterprise) provide subject authority search but not name authorities.
- Bugs in authority record functionality are common in open-source systems like Koha.

How your system represents work instances

- Auckland Libraries' Vega uses "roll-ups" to group manifestations under a work, with tabs for different formats.
- Vega has improved MARC record display and responsiveness to enhancement requests.
- Christchurch City Libraries cited as having a good example of work instance representation.
- Some systems lack work instance functionality entirely (e.g., SirsiDynix Enterprise).

What LMS vendors are doing (or not doing) to support Official RDA changes

- Little to no communication from vendors about Official RDA implementation.
- Many vendors are waiting for Library of Congress and PCC to finalize MARC implementation guidelines.
- Folio is being explored internationally, but limited uptake in NZ; Canterbury

and Massey use Folio hosted by EBSCO.

- Linked data changes are more visible than RDA changes at present.

Whether and how OPACs/Discovery layers engage with linked data

- Linked data integration is still limited; some institutions (e.g., Otago) have enabled Wikipedia entries in discovery results.
- Linked data fields are appearing in MARC records but are not widely used in discovery layers.
- Vega uses BIBFRAME for display, requiring mapping from MARC, which can cause unexpected issues.
- There is interest in tools to leverage linked data fields and authority setups with consistent linked data.

ORDAC Update for December 2025

The Oceania RDA Committee (ORDAC) finishes off the year with some changes to committee membership and roles, and a lot of proposals having been read, discussed and responded to in a busy 2025.

In membership/committee role news, Charlotte Christensen has stepped back as the Oceania Representative to the RDA Steering Committee (RSC). Jack Ennis Butler (Metadata and Discovery Librarian at CSIRO in Canberra) has taken over in this role.

Oceania also has a new RDA Board member: Laura Jamieson from the National Library of New Zealand (NLNZ) will be representing the region as Julia Hickie (National Library of Australia) has finished her term.

As a CatSIG representative on the committee, one of my main tasks is to support Jack in preparing for RSC meetings by reading and providing feedback on discussion papers and proposals.

RDA Steering Committee Meetings

The RSC had a busy final meeting of 2025 in November. A discussion paper on Soft-Deprecated Parallel Elements (e.g. Parallel title proper) was introduced and will be discussed further at the January meeting. Two proposal papers submitted by the North America RDA Committee (NARDAC) were discussed and will be submitted next year as discussion papers.

The Extent Working Group introduced a [suite of proposal papers](#) for a range of extent elements (e.g. dimensions, duration, page counts, column counts etc.). These will also be discussed at the January meeting (which promises to be very busy!).
